Miss Lau Suk Ching (Deputy Head of Geography, Ho Koon Nature Education cum Astronomical Centre (Sponsored by Sik Sik Yuen)) 2. Mr Lee Sai Ming (Senior Scientific Officer, Hong Kong Observatory)	The concerned project was implemented from January 2017 to January 2019, aiming to provide an educational package to enhance the understanding of and clarify common myths about climate change among students, teachers and the general public. A climate change teaching kit is developed based on the latest Senior Secondary Curriculum and Assessment Guide, aiming at helping geography teachers and students (or related disciplines) to have a deeper understanding of climate change and clarifying common misunderstandings through the presentation of the latest scientific evidence and professional analysis. The teaching kit includes a web-based version, board game set and a mobile application. Apart from introducing information about global and local climate change, the mobile application includes a built-in function to collect weather data, and to present and analyse information to facilitate teachers and students to conduct enquiry-based fieldwork. First session of the talk will be introducing the teaching kit while the second part will be providing an update on the latest situation of climate change and its impact. Ms LI Yuet Sheung (Principal of St. Teresa's Kindergarten)	The concerned project was implemented from November 2016 to October 2017, aiming at providing effective training for some 100 pre-school teachers at middle management level so that they can contribute to the overall effectiveness of the schools and in turn work in line with the development of early childhood education in the 21st century. With the enhancement of abilities in curriculum leadership, team leadership, human resources management and crisis management, etc., a highly effective teaching team can then be established, a professional network of middle-management can be expanded and the interface between kindergartens and primary schools can be strengthened.
